Doubting the Easter Facts

On the second Sunday of Easter, the Gospel text is from John 20:19-31, and is commonly referred to as the "Doubting Thomas" text. When the others tell him, "We have seen the Lord!" Thomas is skeptical, *yeah*, *right!*

We tend to judge Thomas harshly for his doubt. But try to put yourself in his sandals: Thomas had witnessed the arrest of our Lord and he was likely in shock over how our Lord was treated and then executed on a cross. What happened to his faith? Common sense would conclude that the crucifixion was the end of the story; that death had the last word. So it would seem possible that he despaired, gave up hope, and fell into unbelief.

The World Today

Like Thomas, God says to us, "You shall have no other gods." And in spite of God's expectation that we fear, love, and trust Him above all else, regardless of what's happening in the world or your personal life.

We worry and fret over this and that. News headlines cause us to worry and wonder about the future. We forget Jesus' words about the "lilies of the field." At the other extreme, when life is smooth sailing and we have surplus money in the bank, prosperity can distract us from God's will and command.

In either situation, our heavenly Father still says, "You shall have no other gods."

Confessing Thomas

One week later, Jesus appears to the disciples again and says to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it my side. Stop doubting and believe," (v. 27).

Thomas blurts out, "My Lord and my God!" (v. 28). In doing so he reveals the state of his heart. He has gone from *Doubting Thomas* to *Confessing Thomas* because it is a great confession of faith.

As followers of the risen Savior, Christ calls each one of us to say these same words with confidence and conviction. My hope and prayer is that you will experience the presence of Christ through His Word to you in Scripture.

In February, we had the opportunity to show a webinar sponsored by Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) titled, "Church & Culture: Guiding the Nex-Gen to a Biblical Understanding of Sexuality". This was shown on a Thursday making it difficult

There was a lot of great information packed into this event. They discussed how to handle situations with understanding, kindness and truth. They also navigated sexuality and identity by exploring biblically grounded strategies to approach this with the younger generation. Another topic talked about was legal insights on gender ideology and the legal implications of addressing these issues and there was a highlight on the public-school policies that parents need to know about.

We are offering this again at a more convenient time! Following the webinar there will also be a discussion led by Pastor Mark. We will be showing this webinar following service on Sunday, April 14th and the evening of Monday, April 15. Here is how each day will look:

- Pat & Cheryl Rioux will be hosting *The Art of Marriage* by FamilyLife. It will be a two-day event. Times will be Friday, April 26 from 6:30pm-9pm and Saturday, April 27 from 9am-3pm. Sign-up for this event is available. This will be held at Faith Lutheran. There will be refreshments on Friday and lunch on Saturday. Cost for the study guide is \$20/couple.
- Faith Comforters meet on Thursdays at 9am in the Narthex. A women's quilting group that meets at Faith.
- Joe Hyatt is hosting a Men's Bible Study on the book of Romans. They meet on Sunday's at 5pm in the Narthex.

Mission & Outreach Team

The Mission & Outreach Team approved a \$750 donation to the family of Erik Olsen, which was then increased to \$3,000 by the Faith Lutheran Church Council at its March meeting. Funds will be charged to the Faith Family Emergency Account. The Olsen family has been struggling with Erik's cancer diagnosis. A benefit for the Olsen family was held Sunday, March 24 at the Little Falls Schools.

The ministry also approved transferring \$3,000 from the Sunbeam Boys Home in Jamaica to the Spring Village Technical School and Medical Clinic to help fund the mission trip March 23 - 31. Eight people are going to Spring Village. The Sunbeam Boys Home was closed in March at a special board meeting of the Sunbeam Association for Mission. The team officially approved suspending all funding to Sunbeam Boys Home.

In other business, the Mission & Outreach Team approved paying expenses for both of Faith's quilting groups that has been budgeted for 2024. The team is also drafting a policy outlining the criteria for Faith to sponsor mission trips and also a general policy for any organization requesting Faith funding. The team hopes to review an initial draft at the next team meeting on April 9. Finally, the team approved April expenditures for March including \$750 to the Morrison County Chaplaincy, \$400 to Hope Harbor, \$500 to Pregnancy Resource Center. The cost to sponsor a child through Compassion International has increased from \$456 to \$516 per year.

March Council Minutes

Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting, March 21st, 2024, 6:30 p.m.

Present: Steve Fellbaum, Joe Hyatt, Michael Johnson, Howie Larsen, Zach Leibold, Tom Lippert, Jim Nelson, Faye Sandy, Chris Scholl, Renae Stueber, Pam Trang, and Pastor Mark

Absent: Steve Tschida

The meeting was called to order by Howie Larsen. Opening prayer was led by Faye Sandy.

Secretary's Report: Jim Nelson moved and Joe Hyatt seconded to purchase a standing desk converter for Pastor Mark costing up to \$250. Motion carried. Funds will come from the Men's Bible Study Fund. Steve Fellbaum moved and Renae Stueber seconded to accept the February Council Minutes. Motion carried. Sarah also shared a few other small items that had come up.

Treasurer's Report: Joe Hyatt presented the February financial reports. Income is a little over \$5k below budget, which is a little better than where we were last January. Expenses are nearly \$4k below budget. Overall, we are about \$1,390 behind where we should be for the budget, this is half of last month's deficit so we are improving. Faye Sandy moved and Chris Scholl seconded to approve the February Treasurer's Reports. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark passed around a card for Randy Wolbeck for the council to sign. There will be two baptisms this coming Sunday, March 24. The staff will have a conference call Monday, March 25th with an Aflac representative to discuss disability and other insurance. Plans for Holy Week and Easter are coming along well.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: Amanda's report shared the recap of the movie Irreplaceable shown on Sunday, March 17th. She also shared information about current and upcoming small groups. The updated website is up and running. The webinar replay will be shown on April 14th and 15th.

Old Business:

Ministry Team Reports:

- Children's Team: Reviewed and changed their duties and responsibilities list. The Easter Egg Hunt is being planned. There will be no Sunday School on Palm Sunday or Easter. The last day of Sunday School and picnic will be May 19th. The last 5 weeks of Sunday School curriculum is to be determined.
- Congregational Life Team: Soup suppers are finished, the money from the freewill offering will be going to the Youth. New Member Sunday was discussed. The brat sale dates have been set for May 31 and June 1. The Easter breakfast is being planned. Howie Larsen moved and Michael Johnson seconded to allow the freewill offering funds from the Easter breakfast to go to the Youth. Motion carried. The Garage Sale date is set for May 4. Chris Scholl moved and Jim Nelson seconded to allot the funds raised from the Garage Sale to replenish the Family Emergency Fund. Motion carried.
- Finance & Management Team: Did not meet. The Pastor's Continuing Education will become a Fund which can roll over from year to year. The CD is now set up at Pine Country Bank, it's set for 9 months so it will mature on December 18th.
- Mission & Outreach Team: The Sunbeam Boys Home is officially closed. The Mission trip is still continuing but they will be hosted by Spring Village. Jim Nelson moved and Tom Lippert seconded to reallocate the \$3000 given to the mission trip team toward a Sunbeam visit to go to Spring Village instead. Motion carried. Funds to Sunbeam have been stopped, we will keep the boys from the Sunbeam Boys home on our prayer lists. The team is working on a policy about mission trips to avoid questions or lack of communication in the future. They hope to bring it to the council by the May meeting.
- Worship & Prayer Team: Did not meet. Everything is set for Palm Sunday and Easter.
- Youth & Family Team: Nine students will be on the Mission trip to Indianapolis. There will be two adult chaperones. One confirmed so far. They are planning or researching several fundraisers coming up. Including: The Soup suppers, Brat Sale, Car Washes, Business donations, a French fry sale and a possible Meat Raffle. The council recommends a budget from the Youth team in the future regarding their fundraising and costs for the mission trip.

Youth Director Search Update: At this time no new candidates have applied. The team will be looking at ways to expand the search. They will even consider partnering with another local church to share a Youth leader.

Road Paving: Further quotes were gathered by Joe Hyatt. They are in the range of \$26,000 so the idea of this is on hold for now as further fundraisers would need to be planned to consider this.

New Business:

Associate Member Idea: Some interested parties who are not yet ready to commit to full membership, recommended the council consider an Associate Member status. This would not allow voting rights within the church but would allow them to maintain contact and still be a part of the church. We currently have several non-members who are active on our contact lists and in the directory. After discussion the council decided a formal title of Associate Member was not necessary as they are still able to be in the directory and maintain contact.

American Flag: Faye Sandy suggested we look into placing an American Flag somewhere on the church property, possibly near the sign. It would need to be lit if left up at night. Zach Leibold will look into some information or quotes.

Family Emergency Fund: The council designated a large amount of this fund toward the Olsen family benefit. Howie Larsen recommends the council consider ways to begin replenishing this fund. The council has agreed to begin with the garage sale funds.

Chris Scholl moved and Howie Larsen seconded to adjourn the March council meeting. Motion carried.

The next meeting will take place April 18th, 2024.
