My Grandma on my Mom's side was born and raised on the same farm in southwest Minnesota. When she was 80 she took a trip with her two daughters out to the east coast. It was her first flight on a plane. Other than that trip, the furthest that she ever traveled out of state was to Sioux Falls, S.D. My Mom was the only sibling to move away from the community. Unlike my Grandma, my Mom and our family moved to six different locations. I was a shy kid and I hated moving and having to start at a new school and make new friends. I have wondered what life would have been like if I had lived my life in just one location.

Kate and I have moved to five different locations since we were married and have now officially relocated for a sixth time to Fergus Falls. I am grateful that we have been able to live and serve in this community for over seventeen years. The members of Faith Lutheran have truly been an extended family to us. Most of you know that Kate accepted the position of Foundation Development Director at Lake Region Healthcare in Fergus Falls. We prayed about this decision before she applied and after she was offered the position. It appeared that doors were being opened for us and that it was time for us to move on.

The word job is not used for ministry positions, rather we use the word "call." We believe that we are called by God and by a congregation to serve. I agree with Martin Luther when he states that people are "called" into many vocations. I trust that Kate has a calling to her position at Lake Region Healthcare. She has God-given talents to serve in this capacity. And Jesus makes it clear that we should not bury our talents. Kate has followed me in my callings several times and I trust that it is my time to move with her. I know that God will also provide me with a calling.

From the time I was a child moving has always brought some apprehension. Change can often create anxiety. I suppose because I have moved so often, I have grown in my confidence that God will provide a way. I also have confidence that God will provide a way forward for this congregation, this Family of Faith. There are always challenges with change. But we also know "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1) And with every new season God promises to be with us, to lead and guide us. With His presence we can overcome any challenge and have the certainty that the change that we experience will only help us grow in our faith.

I truly want to thank you for "your partnership in the Gospel" and for how you have blessed our family over the years. I am grateful that in a changing culture you are a congregation that believes that God's Word does not change. You will continue to be in my prayers. I know this sounds like a farewell letter, however both Annika and I plan on being here through October, so consider this a long midwestern farewell.

## **September Council Minutes**

Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting, September 21st, 2023, 6:30 p.m.

*Present:* Judy Berger, Joel Hanson, Joe Hyatt, Howie Larsen, Zach Leibold, Tom Lippert, Jim Nelson, Cheryl Rioux, Faye Sandy, Renae Stueber and Pastor Nate

Absent: Steve Fellbaum and Denny Myers

The meeting was called to order by Jim Nelson and opening prayer led by Faye Sandy.

**Secretary's Report:** Tom Lippert moved and Howie Larsen seconded to accept the August Council Minutes. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:** Tom Lippert shared the August Financial Reports. Revenue is about \$30,000 behind for the year but \$43,000 ahead of last year. We are \$16,000 below budget on expenses but \$20,000 more than last year. Due to a few large IRA donations, the budget is not concerning at this time. Faye Sandy moved and Joel Hanson seconded to approve the August financial reports. Motion carried. Another large anonymous mortgage principal payment has come in, we will continue with the plan to make the large mortgage principal payment after the last deposit in December. The Youth Summer trip expenses have been finalized. They brought in more money than spent for the trip so their funds will roll over to any events next year.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Nate will be gone Sunday, September 24, Paladin Meyer will fill in. Confirmation classes have started, there are 13 students in the class this year. Nate is considering starting a Sunday morning Adult Education class.

**Youth Leader Report:** Annika's report shared how the start of Youth Group has gone and some events she has attended. Wednesday Youth Group is using the Case for Faith video series by Lee Strobel. Coming up they have the Romans & Christians game on Friday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> and she will be attending more youth events into October.

**Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report:** Amanda shared her ongoing projects including the Directory, and the upcoming Alpha course. She is also planning a Trunk or Treat event on October 28<sup>th</sup>. Maureen Miller will be leading a Women's Bible Study starting October 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Old Business:**

Ministry Team Reports:

- Children's Team: Sunday School began last Sunday. Some classes were rearranged due to the number of students in each grade. The team is still working on how to handle dismissal.
- Congregational Life Team: The Sunday School picnic served 80. Pop, water and ice were donated by the Ruttens. The Bjorge Farewell lunch planning is underway; there will be pork, potato salad, haluskis and the Congregational Life Team will be doing fruit and desserts. Refreshments are also being planned for October 8<sup>th</sup> so people can stay and visit with the Pastor candidate.
- Finance & Management Team: No meeting this month. They did begin striping the parking lot, but more paint needed to be ordered.
- Mission & Outreach Team: Only budgeted payments were sent this month.
- Worship & Prayer Team: No meeting this month. Cheryl Rioux is training some more people to do the sound board and working with Cyndi Stanek to fix some technical difficulties with the video camera.
- Youth & Family Team: The team is hoping to begin planning a mission trip for next year. There were 33 at the softball game on August 27<sup>th</sup>. Romans & Christians is scheduled for Friday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. They've looked into doing the Camp Ripley course again, but it is no longer available.

Call Team Update: Several interviews have been conducted. The team would like to invite one of the Pastor candidates to preach here on October 8<sup>th</sup>. This would involve a hotel room, mileage and a pulpit supply payment. Howie Larsen moved and Zach Leibold seconded to allow up to \$800 from the Memorial: Other fund toward this. Motion carried. Cheryl will set up an account for these pastoral search expenses under the Administrative heading.

#### New Rusiness

Second Harvest Heartland Request: This group, which provides food to senior citizens, is requesting use of the church once per month for their distribution and storage of some leftover boxes. Our only storage option would be the garage which would be frozen during the winter. Howie will contact them to see if that would suffice.

Computer for Videography: Cyndi Stanek has had the same computer for years and is now having issues with it, so it needs to be replaced. Howie Larsen moved and Joe Hyatt seconded to purchase the computer Cheryl Rioux recommends for \$905 with funds coming from our budgeted Computer Repairs and Maintenance account. Motion carried.

*Directory:* Amanda has set up several quotes to have the directory printed. We would still have the email option which would continue to be updated. The printed copies would be ordered once. A sign-up sheet will be placed out to determine how many we need to order. The Men's Bible Study group will cover the costs.

*LCMC Conference*: The conference is October 1-4 in St. Charles, MO. No one is interested in attending from Faith this year.

The meeting closed with prayer.
