Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting, October 19th, 2023, 6:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Jim Nelson and opening prayer led by Joel Hanson.

**Secretary's Report:** Joel Hanson moved and Joe Hyatt seconded to accept the September Council Minutes. Motion carried. Sarah also shared the order form from Coborn's for Poinsettias for Christmas. With the rising costs and tight deadline, the council decided to do something else for poinsettias closer to Christmas time. Sarah also shared a suggestion from the suggestion box regarding tree trimming.

**Treasurer's Report:** Overall giving is down but is similar to last year. A niche in the columbarium has been purchased which will pay off the columbarium loan. Howie Larsen moved and Denny Myers seconded to approve the September financial reports. Motion carried. Sarah also reported the current balance of the Mortgage Principal Fund is: \$83,469 which will be made in a large mortgage principal payment in December.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Nate did the funeral for Tom Bjorge on October 14. Several other members are not doing well. Confirmation class is going well. There will be five confirmed on October 29<sup>th</sup>.

**Youth Leader Report:** Annika's report shared events from October including how their youth group has been doing with the Case for Faith study by Lee Strobel. Annika will be speaking at Fields of Faith on October 25<sup>th</sup>. The Youth will also be helping with Trunk or Treat and in November, the Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes. When they are finished with the Case for Faith study they will move on to the Life Revealed series.

**Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report:** Amanda shared how Alpha is going, the upcoming Women's Bible Study and the Trunk or Treat plans.

#### **Old Business:**

Ministry Team Reports:

- Children's Team: The Children's Christmas program has been scheduled for Sunday, December 17. Rehearsals will be the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of December. The winter Sunday School curriculum has been ordered.
- Congregational Life Team: Roadside cleanup was Sunday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. It went well. Plans are underway for the Confirmation reception. The Christmas Boutique sale has been set for Saturday, December 2. Howie Larsen moved and Joe Hyatt seconded to send the funds to the Mortgage principal. Motion carried.
- Finance & Management Team: No meeting this month. Next month they will begin on budgets.
- Mission & Outreach Team: The funds sent to the Nicaragua mission are on pause by request of the host church as they figure out their missions. Howie Larsen moved and Judy Berger seconded to give up to \$2500 toward the Alpha retreat to help cover costs. This will come from the funds the Mission team already has allocated to them. Motion carried.
- Worship & Prayer Team: Next meeting is scheduled for November.
- Youth & Family Team: Covered by the Youth Director report.

#### New Business:

*End-of-Year Business*: At this time the council is looking forward toward the business needed at the end of the year. Preparing to set budgets, considering the nominating team as we have 4 members going off the council and none will be running for re-election, and setting up the audit for January which is recommended to be done by someone outside the congregation this year.

*Wireless Mics for camera:* Cyndi Stanek has been having issues with the sound on the new camera and recommends we order a new wireless microphone for the camera. Joe Hyatt moved and Denny Myers seconded to make this purchase up to \$300. Motion carried.

*Snowplowing Bid:* A bid was received from Seward and Sons regarding snowplowing for the upcoming winter season. The price has increased to \$150/plow. Steve Fellbaum moved and Zach Leibold seconded to approve this bid and hire Seward and Sons for snowplowing. Motion carried.

**Call Team Update**: After the visit and serious consideration the call team unanimously votes to call Pastor Mark Johnson. If the council approves this call as well, the vote will then go to the congregation. This will require calling a congregational meeting which will be announced for two Sundays prior and an email/postcard will be sent to all

members. Denny Myers moved and Steve Fellbaum seconded to approve the call of Pastor Mark Johnson and schedule the congregation meeting for Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>. Motion carried.

Joel Hanson moved and Zach Leibold seconded to adjourn the October Council meeting.
