Lent in Daily Life

"Let Anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches." Revelation 2:11

What is "Lent?"?

The word "Lent" is based on the Middle English word *lente* which meant *spring* which was based on the Old English word *lengten* which meant *"to lengthen [the daylight]."*

Lent is a period of 40 days – not counting Sundays – prior to Easter, beginning with Ash Wednesday to commemorate Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness when he prepared for his ministry though prayer and fasting and then was tempted by the devil. Holy Week commemorates Christ's last week of life on earth and is the most important part of lent.

Already, we notice the period of daylight lengthening with each new day. It's a sign that it's time for the season of Lent, which serves as an annual reminder to Christians that we still need to repent; that we still need to engage in the spiritual discipline of study and renewal; that we dare not take our Lord's great gift of grace for granted. During Lent, the days slowly lengthen until they burst into the brilliance of spring on Easter morning. So it is with our life: We go from the darkness of sin to the light of righteousness in Christ; from despair to hope which is the treasure that only Christ can give.

This Year's Theme: "The Seven Churches of Revelation."

Enjoy the fellowship of the Congregational Supper each week starting at 6:00 pm. Beginning February 21st. Music for the Wednesday Lenten services will include the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy. Our theme this year will be the "Seven Churches of Revelation."

January Council Minutes

Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting, January 18th, 2024, 6:30 p.m.

Absent: Steve Fellbaum and Tom Lippert

The meeting was called to order and opening prayer led by Jim Nelson.

Secretary's Report: Judy Berger moved and Joel Hanson seconded to accept the December Council Minutes. Motion carried. Sarah shared a suggestion from the suggestion box, information about the furnace repair and concerns about the sprinkler system sensors in the attic.

Treasurer's Report: Cheryl Rioux stepped in to present the Treasurer's reports. Revenue for 2023 was well above budget with total expenditures falling below budget. Between the budget numbers and the large Mortgage Principal payment, the finances are looking great going into 2024. Denny Myers moved and Howie Larsen seconded to approve the December Treasurer's Reports. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark shared his planned vacation and continuing education days so far. He would also like to schedule an "Ask the Pastor" event in February. Denny Myers moved and Joel Hanson seconded to approve Pastor Mark's requested W2 change; moving \$1149.46 from Pastor Mark's salary to Housing Allowance based on receipts of actual expenses. This will incur a fee from our payroll company as well. Motion carried. Currently being scheduled: New Member Information sessions then a New Member Sunday, First Communion Classes as well as Lent worship and events.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: "The Art of Marriage" materials have been ordered, the dates for this are TBD. After Easter, Tod Tonsager will begin a Wednesday evening Bible study. The Tuesday Women's Bible study will be wrapping up in February. The Directory is finished and ready to go to print.

For security on Wednesday evenings, it was recommended that the doors be locked after a certain time since no one is watching them during Confirmation and Youth Group.

Old Business:

Ministry Team Reports:

- •Children's Team: did not meet.
- •Congregational Life Team: Bev Larsen is leaving the team so they are looking for new members. They will be providing treats the day of the Annual Meeting.
- •Finance & Management Team: Did not meet.
- •Mission & Outreach Team: Kennard Fellbaum has stepped up to be the chair this year. They try to split their support evenly between State, Local and International missions.
- •Worship & Prayer Team: Did not meet.
- •Youth & Family Team: The Youth Director job description is now posted on the LCMC website. The New Year's Eve Bash was a success with about 20 students attending. Wednesday Youth Group seems to be going well. They are watching videos from Alpha Life Revealed and then doing small groups. A mission trip can hopefully be planned for this summer.

Columbarium: Still no information to order the nameplate so this is still on hold.

Nominating Committee Update: The candidates are: Steve Tschida, Mike Johnson, Chris Scholl and Pam Trang.

Audit Report: Renee Miller graciously assisted us with our Audit. She was given information regarding our practices and was able to look through our financial reports. Everything looks good.

New Business:

Repairs and Maintenance: Following the large furnace repair an annual inspection was set up with Thelen to hopefully prevent further large issues. Faye Sandy moved and Joel Hanson seconded to increase the repairs and maintenance budget to \$6000 to hopefully cover any further building issues. Motion carried.

Morrison County Record Directory: The Record reached out to offer us the ability to place an ad in their annual Directory. Howie Larsen moved and Renae Stueber seconded to place a 1/8 page ad from the Worship & Prayer Advertising budget. Motion carried.

Future Officers: The Council treasurer needs to step down as his time has been served so the council needs to start thinking about whether they would be willing to step into a leadership role on the council following the Annual meeting.

Church Credit Card: Pastor Nate needs to be removed from the church credit card account. Someone else needs to be the main contact person for the credit card. Faye Sandy agreed to put herself onto the credit card.

Desktop Computer for Pastor: Cheryl Rioux recommends the purchase of a desktop computer for Pastor Mark. She presented a deal she was able to negotiate with HP for the order. Joe Hyatt moved and Denny Myers seconded to approve this purchase for \$1136.10 with sales tax being credited back after purchase. Motion carried.

Security: It has come to the attention of the security team that doors are not always being properly secured. An email was sent out to keyholders to remind them to make sure the doors are latched. Denny Myers also recommends more security for the youth on Wednesdays.
