Reformation Today

"We cannot keep from speaking about what we have seen and heard."
Acts 4:20

The *Reformation* started on October 31st, 1517, when a priest by the name of Martin Luther pounded his 95 Theses to chapel door in Wittenberg, Germany. These were 95 points for how the church of that time should shape up or *reform* itself to be faithful to God's calling. For example, he wanted to end the practice of asking people to pay money to have their sins forgiven. He also wanted the pope to realize that the only reason he had any authority to retain or forgive sins (office of Keys) was because of scripture – not the pope's man-made authority. At that point, Luther was the loyal opposition trying to reform the church from within. At the heart of his constructive criticism was, and is, God's holy Word. Needless to say, Martin Luther's first try at reforming the church was not received very favorably.

But, by God's grace, he persevered and he refused to give up just because human authorities disapproved. God's Word had become like a burning fire shut up in his bones (Jeremiah 20:9). He couldn't ignore it.

The Reformation was sparked by God's Word which had to be shared.

For Luther, it was like a life-line that had to be thrown out to people who desperately needed help. He wanted people to know about passages like Jeremiah 31:34, "...I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more." He wanted people to know about passages like Romans 3:24, that tells us we are made right with God by the grace of Jesus; that we are saved by believing in Jesus, not because of our good works.

How do we carry on the practice of *Reformation*? It starts with taking God's Word to heart to the point that we cannot keep from telling others about this Good News of Jesus Christ.

I look forward to seeing you at worship on Reformation Sunday, October 27 which is also Confirmation Sunday. As part of our Reformation celebration, on October 20, we will commemorate John Hus, a reform minded preacher who preceded Luther by 100 years.

This is another under-appreciated, un-thanked for, and unnoticed background thing that makes our communion services beautiful. Thanks to all the wonderful bread makers.

It was brought up at council that it would be a good idea to have additional people help with the sound system during worship. This is a background thing that goes unnoticed during the service. Without sound technicians and projectionists, the worship services would be not nearly so organized or easy to follow. Thank all of you who have stepped forward to take care of this important work.

Along with sound and video, there are the things that go into communion preparation. Before the service, there are volunteers who fill the wine chalices, ensure the bread is plated, and make sure the wine cups and baskets are in place. Thank all of you who help with communion set up and clean up. Without your diligence, communion services would not go nearly as planned.

There are many others we need to acknowledge and thank for what they do behind the scenes. Nursery attendants; Sunday School teachers; those who work with our youth; those who take care of landscaping and maintenance; those who care for the beauty of the columbarium and flowers at the entrance to our church; the musicians; scripture readers; communion assistants; quilters; refreshment providers; coffee makers, and those who participate in Roadside cleanup. The list goes on and on. Thank all of you who do those things for being so willing to make this congregation a welcoming, beautiful place to worship.

We would like even more people to step up and be part of the

"background" folks who make things work at Faith. Please don't hesitate to become another unsung hero or heroine. It is surprising how fulfilling, fun, and satisfying that is.

September Council Minutes

September 19th, 2024 (6:30 pm)

Present: Pastor Mark Johnson, Howie Larsen, Joe Hyatt, Tom Lippert, Jim Nelson, Faye Sandy, Chris Scholl, Renae Stueber, Pam Trang, Steve Tschida, Sarah Kalkbrenner. Absent: Steve Fellbaum, Michael Johnson, Zach Leibold Howie called the meeting to order. Chris opened with prayer.

Additions to Agenda:

Justin Juelke & Julie Shelstad spoke for the Worship Team – Sound board: Volunteers are needed to run the sound board. He needs a consistent backup. Justin has tried to find volunteers but has been unable to get any firm commitments. Faye, Steve T., and Sarah are willing to train and go on a rotation. Justin needs to be available for rehearsals, so someone else needs to be on the soundboard then also

A sub is needed for Joan on the piano. Currently she has to be at every service and rehearsal. He wondered if a part time (one weekend a month/fill-in) pianist could be hired. This would give Joan a break once a month and give us a fill-in if needed. Chris will check with Amy to see about posting a notice at St Francis about the position. Currently there is no job description for the pianist. Justin asked that one be put together. Responsibilities: one rehearsal during the week, rehearsal and service on Sunday morning one week a month or as needed.

15th Anniversary of Faith Lutheran will be November 3rd. The council discussed whether we should plan something special for the anniversary. It was suggested to keep it low key due to the short planning time available. Suggestions were to invite someone to church that Sunday, have cake, and maybe a slide show.

Secretary's report: Joe moved to accept the minutes. Steve T. seconded the motion. The motion carried. Sarah shared the quilters have removed almost all of their items from the attic. Joe and Jim will work on getting everything else out. The newsletter deadline is Monday. Suggestions from the suggestion box were read and discussed. Sound issues in the nursery – Justin is addressing. Use wafers instead of bread for Communion – A special thank you to those for making bread for communion. The Alter Guild will be asked to wait for the fresh bread when setting up on Communion Sundays. There was also a request that preaching follow the lectionary.

Treasurer's report: Joe highlighted the general & reserves funds – they are looking good. We want to keep the general fund over \$25,000. Giving is \$32,222.84 under budget and expenses are \$37,166.71 under budget, so we are \$7,708.81 to the good for the year. Tom moved to accept the treasurer's report, Jim seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Pastor's Report: A funeral was held yesterday at the church. The family was very complimentary of the service and the lunch. Outdoor worship went well. We have new Lucky Duck Bean Bag Tournament champs - the Byers family. Pastor Mark gave a special thank you to those who helped him move his parents. He is volunteering (preaching) once a month at the Highland Senior Center. He will be starting a Book Club for the church to explore issues in depth.

Pastor Mark requested the council read "Religious Liberty in Crisis" by Ken Starr. He has a copy that can be borrowed. We need to be aware of how we would handle transgender issues and understand legal issues for hiring and teaching. We will also want to make sure our definition of marriage is included in the constitution and by-laws. Sarah shared that our insurance company has offered a free legal review of our by-laws. Faye moved that we have the insurance company review our bylaws, Chris seconded. The motion carried.

Maintaining membership rolls — we should be proactive in checking in with those who stop attending, and then moving them to the inactive list if they do not want to continue with us. They would then be removed from membership after a specified period of time. Pastor Mark said he is getting ready for confirmation. Confirmation Sunday will be Oct 27th. There will be 10 confirmands this year. There are 7 adults in membership class. He has been doing shut-in and family visits and did 1 hospital visit.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: Trunk or Treat will be offered again this year on October 26th. The hours will be from 1 to 3 this year. Amanda is looking for volunteers to volunteer their trunks and for setup.

Old Business

Ministry Team Reports

- Children's (Renae): They discussed Sunday School. She taught the first day it went well.
- Congregational Life (Pam) Faye will check into getting mugs to give to visitors and new members. Pastor and Sarah are checking if the 17th of November will work for Johan & Sonya Hinderlie to do their presentation.
- Finance & Management (Joe) did not meet. Deb Colombe picked up a bat house that will be installed.
- Mission & Outreach (Tom) Tom moved that we donate \$500 each to Mt Carmel and World Mission Prayer League. Steve T. seconded. The motion carried. Faye passed along a Bible idea received from David Maier to Tom to take to the committee.
- Worship & Prayer (Faye) already covered earlier in the meeting.
- Youth & Family (Renae) The youth computer needs to be updated, the memory is full. Cheryl Rioux will be asked about upgrading the computer. Youth group started last night and went well.

Youth Director Offer – The compensation package was reviewed: \$40,000 Base Salary, \$1,000 Pension, \$1,000 Continuing Education, \$3,060 FICA & Withholding, 3 weeks vacation including 3 Sundays, and 1-to-1 Comp Time after mission trips or retreats. The Call Committee met, they have a candidate they want to offer the position to. The Call Committee talked about getting her some theological training. A full-time position will be offered. Faye moved to offer the youth director position to Heather Byers, pending background check, at the compensation package proposed. Renee seconded the motion. The motion carried.

New Business

Employee handbook – It was pointed out that we don't have an employee handbook. Chris and Jim will work on putting one together. Job descriptions for all employees will need to be included.

Employee reviews – Pastor Mark will do with all of the employees. The council went over the evaluation form that will be used. Safety Deposit Box – Jim Nelson and George Sandy are still listed on the safety deposit box. This needs to be updated. Tom moved to remove Jim Nelson and George Sandy from Safety Deposit box signature card and to authorize Sarah Kalkbrenner and Faye Sandy as signers on the safety deposit box. Joe seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Credit card – Faye and Sarah got a credit card application from the bank. It was passed on to Joe so the finance committee can complete it and decide which card to apply for.

Steve Tschida will open with prayer at the next meeting. Chris moved to close the meeting, Howie seconded the motion. The motion carried. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
