From Pastor Mark...

Preparing for Holy Week: Why is Good Friday Called *Good*?

"Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 12:2 (KJV)

On Friday, March 29, Christians will observe Good Friday as part of Holy Week. This explanation of why Good Friday is called *Good* is based on a devotional by the faithfully departed theologians Gerhard Frost and Gerhard Belgum.

When the writer of Hebrews says that Jesus is the "finisher" of our faith (Hebrews 12:2), our minds are irresistibly drawn to a word that Christ spoke on the Cross. We call it the Sixth Word: "It is *finished*!" (John 19:30).

What was finished? The *perfect life* was *finished*. The only perfect life in the world's history was, in a matter of moments, not just ended, but completed. What does it mean? It means that He did for us what we cannot do for ourselves, fulfill to perfect completeness the Holy Law (what we *should* do). It means that His righteousness is now ours through Grace (this is GOSPEL, the Good News of what God *does for us*). This is possible if we live in a vital and unhypocritical relationship of trust in Jesus Christ. The perfect life was *finished*.

What was finished? *His suffering was finished*. The physical torture of nails, the crown of thorns, the ugly anger of the crowd, and the suffering brought on by my sins. He was willing to take on our griefs and our sorrows. Now His suffering is finished.

What was finished? *Your forgiveness was finished*. Your power to live a life that counts. Your eternal reconciliation with God. All this was finished. Now you are clean through His blood.

And so the writer to the Hebrews tells us, "Look to Him who is the author and finisher of our faith." Set aside the things that hold you back. Run the race with patience. When weary and faint, look to the Christ of the Cross. This is the Word of and from God today: *Look to the Christ of the Cross*.

Greetings Family of Faith,

And when trials come my way, this verse is one I need to turn to. From Romans 12:12 - "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulations, be constant in prayer."

We have seen change first hand at Faith during the last few months. Pastor Mark has brought us new ideas; different ways of conducting worship services; and a challenge to dig deeper into the Bible. He has done these things not to force his will on us but to present different perspectives in ways to worship God; to think of new ways to spread the Good News of Christ; and to bring us closer to God through His teachings in the Bible. Along with Pastor Mark, we are blessed to have Sarah and Isaac with us. All of them are so outgoing and willing to be a big part of our faith journey together.

February Council Minutes

Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting, February 15th, 2024, 6:30 p.m.

Present: Joe Hyatt, Michael Johnson, Howie Larsen, Zach Leibold, Tom Lippert, Jim Nelson, Faye Sandy, Chris Scholl, Renae Stueber, Pam Trang, Steve Tschida and Pastor Mark

Absent: Steve Fellbaum

The meeting was called to order and opening prayer led by Howie Larsen. Howie then welcomed the new council members.

Secretary's Report: Joe Hyatt moved and Tom Lippert seconded to accept the January Council Minutes, Annual meeting minutes and Council organizational minutes. Motion carried. Sarah also shared that she is working on updating the bulletin board and encouraging teams to update their contact lists and duties and responsibilities.

Treasurer's Report: Joe Hyatt presented the January financial reports. Income is \$4k below budget, which is in line with where we were last January. Expenses are about \$1,200 below budget. Overall, we are about \$3k behind where we should be for the budget. This is similar to where we were last year at this time. Jim Nelson moved and Tom Lippert seconded to approve the January Treasurer's Reports. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark had a meeting with Dave ZumBerge to discuss the current security protocols. He was impressed with the work the team puts in to training and security. The Alliance Defending Freedom webinar was today, 18 attended. Pastor Mark would like to schedule some sessions to re-watch the webinar on Sunday, April 14th after worship and the following day in the evening. Pastor Mark's new tax preparer recommends a change to the Housing Allowance. Tom Lippert moved and Faye Sandy seconded to approve a change to reallocate \$4k per year from salary to Housing Allowance. Motion carried. New Member information packets are being put together for the New Member information sessions which will be February 25 and March 3. The New Member Sunday is tentatively scheduled for March 10. Pastor Mark will also work on a statement of expectations for members which will be presented to the council next month. Eventually this will be something to put in the new member packets.

Ministry Volunteer Coordinator Report: Amanda's report shared the Visitation team she is working on putting together and what this team would be responsible for. The website is nearly ready with just a few additional items to update before it can go live. She also shared information about the webinar and how after the discussion, the group felt sharing it with a larger group of the congregation would be beneficial, as these aren't issues just those with children are facing.

Old Business:

Ministry Team Reports:

- Children's Team: Discussed the Christmas program needing one more rehearsal. Sunday School dismissal will be announced after the Children's message, an adult will help lead the kids to their classrooms. Lessons are being planned to be 25 minutes. A new Sunday School curriculum is being considered. Easter Egg hunt is being planned. They would like to have something about the meaning of Easter, not just candy. VBS is being planned for June 3-7. It will be at Alliance this year.
- Congregational Life Team: Debbie Nelson joined the team. Bev Larsen has applied to Coborns for the Brat sale again this year. Soup supper planning is underway. Joe Hyatt moved and Steve Tschida seconded to approve the Soup supper funds going to the Youth Mission Trip, as recommended by the team. Motion carried.
- Finance & Management Team: Guards for the attic sprinklers are done. Deb Colombe is working on creating a committee to oversee the columbarium. Pastor Mark has requested his Continuing education budget roll over from year to year if not used. This would require creating a fund. Jim Nelson moved and Steve Tschida seconded to create a fund for the continuing education money. Motion carried.
- Mission & Outreach Team: Pat Rioux is now the chair of this team. They will not be meeting until February 20th.
- Worship & Prayer Team: Updated their duties and responsibilities as well as their contact list, discussed Lent and Easter services coming up and the Worship band and how things are working there.
- Youth & Family Team: Joel Hanson is currently running this team. The mission trip is being planned to Indianapolis July 13-20. 2024 Goals: Howie Larsen recommended the council think on some goals for the congregation to work toward. Pastor Mark shared a diagram about our mission statement and values covering certain questions and how the goals should work toward the other questions we would need answered.

Sprinkler System in Attic: Joe Hyatt took care of protecting the sprinkler heads in the attic, but the area is not really meant for storage It's meant for maintenance to access furnaces, the stairs are very steep and dangerous and storage in that area can actually be a fire hazard. The door is kept locked but the key is in the office and openly accessible. After the garage sale, the garage will be cleaned out and storage will be offered there but will need to be removed from the attic area for safety.

Jamaica Mission Trip: Gene Hyatt joined the meeting to discuss the issues with Sunbeam Boys' Home and why the mission trip has been delayed. He shared 1 Peter 5:2-5 and shared information regarding what he knows of what's happening. The group is all adults and despite caution recommended on Jamaican travel, they still wish to go although they have looked into alternate locations. They hope to go March 23-31. The council decided to defer to the Mission & Outreach team and their recommendations and so recommended Gene to attend the Mission team meeting on the 20th.

Council Installation: February 25th.

Blue Star Flag/Armed Forces Devotional: In support for our members who are on active duty in the military we would like to display a blue star flag and share some Armed Forces devotional books with them. Howie will help determine how many stars we should display and how many are on active duty.

Thrivent Share Certificate Rollover: Jim Nelson will check the rates at US Bank and Sarah will check at Thrivent and they will bring recommendations back.

Website: Chris Scholl moved and Zach Leibold seconded to renew the subscription at wix.com using the funds from the Erik Mathison memorial. Motion carried. Amanda is working to get the website ready.

Driveway Paving: Patrick shared an estimate to have the gravel portion of our entrance drive paved. Although this is technically owned by the city, we could still pave it. The estimate is \$19,900. Joe Hyatt and George Sandy will get a few more bids before any decision is made, but a fundraiser would need to done in order to raise the money to do this.

Bank Authorized Signers: The council members have changed so those authorized to sign at the bank also needs to change. James "Jim" Nelson, Cheryl Rioux and George Sandy need to be removed. Howie Larsen, Joe Hyatt and Faye Sandy will need to be added. Sarah Kalkbrenner will
